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## **Royal Montcourt Grande Cuvee Brut NV**

crisp and fresh, a great way to start the afternoon  
Ashed chevre, green apple

## **Wolfberger Alsace Black Pinot Gris**

smooth finish on the palate with nice roasted notes  
Smoked tomato jam, roasted almonds, smoked cheddar tarts

## **Devils Lair Honeycomb Chardonnay**

strong flavour with a dry finish, classic example of great Aussie wine  
triple cream brie, to coat the tongue which really helps to let the wine shine through

## **Tahbilk Marsanne**

smooth finish with nice nuttiness  
crisp melon & jamon iberico

## **Rose D'Amelie AOC Luberon Rose**

beautiful colour, nice freshness and very soft on the palate  
truffle and caramelised onion, with aged cheddar

## **Georges Duboeuf Beaujolais Village**

amazing flavour similar to pinot noir, fresh & clean, raspberry flavour shines through  
Comte & fresh raspberries, the best pairing from the day.

## **Tilia Malbec**

strong bold flavour, nice tannins, great finish  
wagyu bresaola, 30 month aged reggiano

## **Ruffino Aziano Chianti Classico**

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Royal Montcourt Grande Cuvee Brut NV = Aged for over 15 months this wine is characterised by light toasty notes, a well-balanced and elegant finish. This family-owned Champagne producer has over 200 years of experience ensuring this indulgence is expertly crafted. Blend of 50% Pinot Noir, 35% Pinot Meunier and 15% Chardonnay

Wolfberger Alsace Black Pinot Gris = Established in 1902, the wine co-operative Wolfberger, led by Head Winemaker Jérôme Keller, is based in the historic city of Eguisheim, Alsace, where oenologists are considered "taster, technician and magician". Wolfberger sources fruit from 420 growers working across 1200 hectares of vines. It's one of our favourite producers in Alsace, not least for the Wolfberger Black Pinot Gris, which is beautifully restrained, it contains less residual sugar than most Alsatian Gris which allows the purity of the fruit to shine through. It's rich and balanced on the palate. This is a wine with great persistence, delicately flavoured with roasted notes.

Tahbilk Marsanne = We've long thought of this as one of Australia's best dry whites, so it's fitting that this year it took top honours, winning Best Value White Wine for its textural mouthfeel, full flavours and gorgeous nose. Notable for its ability to age, it's hard to believe this could go from 10/10 to 11/10! 'One of the world's rarest grape varieties is Marsanne, which has its origins in northern Rhone and Hermitage in France. Some of the world's oldest Marsanne vines are actually much closer to home. Tahblik winery in the central Victorian region of Nagambie Lakes is not only home to vines that date back to 1927. The estate is also the world's largest single holding of the varietal.'- James Halliday Wine Companion 2016 Winery Of The Year.

Devils Lair Honeybomb Chardonnay = A well-structured wine offering both elegance and generosity of flavour. Stone fruits mingled with toasted nuts provide a complex array of flavours over a core citrus backbone.

Rose D'Amelie AOC Luberon Rose = Rosé D'amelie is a crisp and fruity French rosé with notes of wild strawberries and fresh cherries. Vines have flourished in the Luberon for hundreds of years with the grapes benefiting from the warmth of the Mediterranean climate whilst retaining a lovely fresh finish. A wonderful crisp and fruity Rose with notes of wild strawberries and fresh cherries. Perfect as an aperitif or as a partner to fish and shellfish, chicken dishes and salads.

Georges Duboeuf Beaujolais Village = Excellent depth for a Beaujolais-Villages. The nose displays youthful aromas of inky cherry and raspberry followed by a touch of spice. The lighter-bodied palate presents flavours of cherry, spice and delicate raspberry. Made from the Gamay grape this wine is soft, silky and sure to please. • Finalist Best International Red | Vintage Cellars 2021 Best Of Awards.

Ruffino Aziano Chianti Classico = A lot has happened in the more than 140 vintages that have passed since Ruffino was first established by cousins Ilario and Leopoldo Ruffino. Now Italy stands as one of the giants of the wine world, a reputation built in no small part thanks to Ruffino. Over the years there have been many awards and they've led the way by pioneering many firsts. Today, Ruffino is comprised of six estates from across northern Italy that makes 54 different wines. This historic and dynamic producer is still creating the story of Italian wine to this day. Synonymous with both prestige and beauty, a wine of outstanding quality, it is also an area located in the heart of Central Italy's Tuscany region. The wine is a deep ruby-purple colour; cherry, leather and earthy nose; dry, medium-bodied, bright cherry and vanilla flavours with soft tannins in a medium-long finish.
